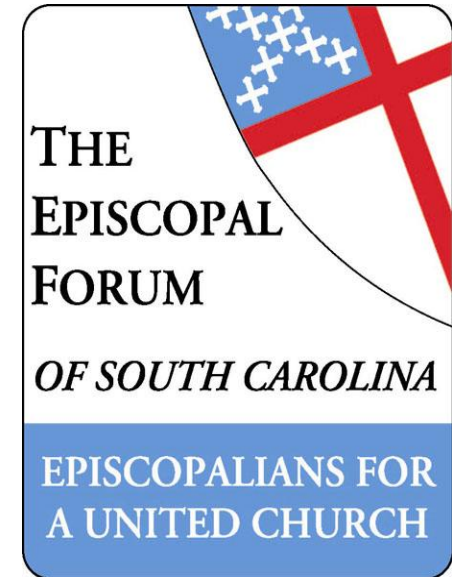

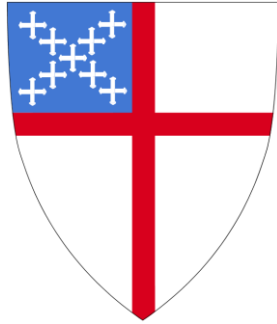

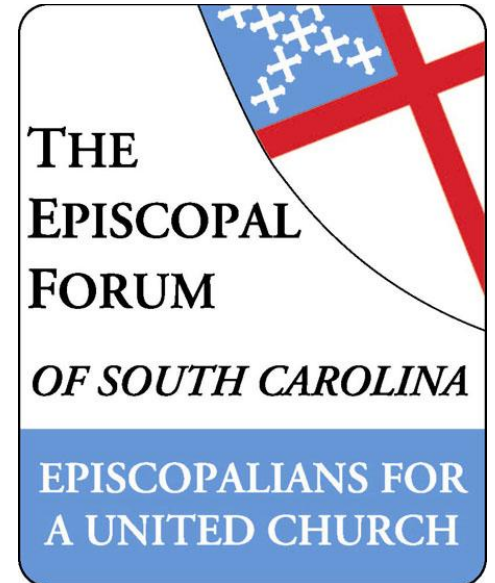
For the Mission of the Church
